HOT TAKES:

- The HEAT are a perfect 11-0 this season when Duncan Robinson scores at least 20 points.
- The HEAT has 23 road wins so far this season, the second-most in the Eastern Conference.
- Miami is allowing just 108.5 points per game this season, the fourth-least in the NBA, and have now held opponents to under their season scoring averages in 18-straight games, including 30 of 31 overall, doing so by an average of -11.9 points per game over that span.
- Terry Rozier III has averaged 20.3 points (122 total) over his last six games while shooting 47.7 percent (42-of-88) from the field, 56 percent (28-of-50) from three-point range and 90.9 percent (10-of-11) from the foul line.

DOUBLING UP: Bam Adebayo posted a 20-point, 12-rebound double-double on 4/7 at IND, marking his 191st career double-double, the third-most in franchise history. Only Rony Seikaly and Alonzo Mourning have recorded more in HEAT history. Additionally, it marked as his team-leading 42nd double-double of the season, the most during a single season in his career. TERRY DISHING: Terry Rozier III dished out four assists with no turnovers on 4/7 at IND, marking his ninth zero turnover game since joining the HEAT on 1/23. He has now dished out 144 assists and committed just 41 turnovers with Miami, resulting in a 3.51 assist-to-turnover ratio, which would be the fourth-highest ratio for a single-season in franchise history. Additionally, 18 different players have started at least one game this season, tying the second-most during a single-season in franchise history, only two-way players Cole Swider and Alondes Williams have yet to start a game this season. .500+: With their 41st win of the season on 3/31 at WAS, Miami has secured their 14th season of at least a .500 record since Erik Spoelstra became head coach 16 years ago in 2008-09. The 14 .500+ seasons over the last 16 years tie for the most in the NBA over that span. Below are the most .500+ seasons in the league since Spoelstra became head coach, including this season.

COACH SPO: Erik Spoelstra has recorded 856 career wins (747 regular season & 109 postseason) with the HEAT, the fourth-most by a head coach with a single franchise in NBA history. Next on the list is Red Auerbach (Celtics) with 885, followed by Jerry Sloan (Jazz) and Gregg Popovich (Spurs). Additionally, Spoelstra has coached over 1,000 career regular season games, becoming just the third coach in NBA history to coach 1,000+ games with only one franchise for his entire career, joining Gregg Popovich (Spurs) and Al Attles (Warriors).

15/15/5: Bam Adebayo recorded 15 points, 16 rebounds and five steals on 3/24 vs. CLE, becoming just the second player in HEAT history to post at least a 15/15/5 game, joining only Glen Rice (38pts, 16rebs, 5stls) who accomplished the feat on 11/26/93 at BOS. Additionally, it marked Adebayo's 35th career 15+ rebound game, the fourth-most in team history. Below are the most 15+ rebound games in franchise history.

TYLER FROM DEEP: Tyler Herro has currently connected on a three-point field goal in 30-straight games, the second-longest streak of his career. 700: Tyler Herro has currently made 722 three-point field goals, just the fifth player in franchise history to connect on at least 700 treys, and now has the third-most made in team history. He previously connected on his 700th three-point field goal on 2/2 at WAS, becoming the second-fastest player in HEAT history to reach his 700th from downtown (272 games), only Duncan Robinson has achieved the feat faster at an NBA-record 216 games. PATTY MAKES: Patty Mills made his HEAT debut on 3/8 at OKC, scoring 13 points, all off the bench, marking as the third-most points in a HEAT debut after the All-Star break by a reserve. Only Derek Anderson (14 points) on 3/4/06 and Jamal Mashburn (14 points) on 2/15/97 have more. Additionally, Mills has now made 1,235 career three-point field goals off the bench, tying the third-most off the bench by any player in NBA history. TERRY FROM THE LINE: Terry Rozier III has shot 91.3 percent (63-of-69) from the foul line since joining Miami, including a streak of 21-straight, the sixth-longest streak of his career. Additionally, he shot a perfect 11-of-11 from the free throw line on 2/2 at WAS, the second-most made without a miss during a game in his career. GAME WINNERS: Bam Adebayo hit the game-winning buzzer-beater last night at DET, marking his second game-winning basket with under a second to play, tying the second-most in team history (since play-by-plays were tracked in 1996). Earlier this season, Jimmy Butler also connected on his second game-winning basket as a member of the HEAT on 12/16 vs. CHI. THE ROOK: Jaime Jaquez Jr. scored 25 points, all off the bench, on 3/8 at OKC, his fourth 20-point game as a reserve (now eight total with four as a starter). His four 20-point games off the bench are the fifth-most by a HEAT rookie in franchise history. Additionally, he scored in double-figures in 13-straight games from 11/20 – 12/16. The last HEAT rookie to score in double-figures in at least 13 consecutive games is Dwyane Wade at 15 from 11/28/03 – 12/29/03. Below are the most 20-point games by a rookie reserve in HEAT history.

18+: Five different HEAT players scored at least 18 points on 4/7 at IND, marking just the fourth time in team history at least five players have done so. Jimmy Butler (27), Tyler Herro (21), Bam Adebayo (20), Caleb Martin (20) and Nikola Jović (18) all accomplished the feat. Miami also did so earlier this season on 12/11 at CHA as well as 4/28/21 vs. SA and 3/22/96 at MIL.

TRIPLE-DOUBLES: Bam Adebayo posted a 16-point, 12-rebound, 11-assist triple-double at MIL on 2/13, his seventh as a member of the HEAT, the third-most in team history, and his second this season after posting a 22-point, 19-rebound, 10-assist triple-double vs. LAL on 11/6, marking as just the third triple-double in team history with at least 15 boards, joining Lamar Odom (30 points, 19 rebounds, 11 assists) on 3/6/04 vs. SAC and Butler (20 points, 18 rebounds, 10 assists) on 12/10/19 vs. ATL. 1,000 POINTS: Jimmy Butler scored his 1,000th point of the season on 3/15 at DET, marking as his 10th-straight season reaching the milestone, including in each of his five seasons with the HEAT. He has become just the second player in team history to reach the 1,000-point mark in every season as a member of the HEAT (minimum five seasons), joining only Glen Rice who did so in all six of his seasons from 1989-1995. Butler's five consecutive seasons reaching 1,000 points now tie the third-longest overall streak in franchise history. Below are the longest such streaks.

OH WHAT A NIGHT: The HEAT recorded a 60-point, 142-82, win vs. POR on 3/29, marking as the highest margin of victory in franchise history, surpassing their previous high by 17 points, which was a 43-point win (126-83) on 12/29/94 vs. LAC. It also was just the ninth game in NBA history with a margin of victory of at least 60 points. The 142 points tied for the third-most points in team history, only their 149-point outing on 3/19/18 vs. DEN and their 144-point performance on 4/5/22 vs. CHA are more. Additionally, Miami dished out 41 assists, the most in HEAT history, surpassing their previous best of 39 assists, which has been done twice. 1,000 3FGM: Duncan Robinson connected on the 1,000th three-point field goal of his career on 3/17 at DET, doing so in his 343rd career game, becoming the fastest player in NBA history to connect on their 1,000th trey, surpassing the previous record of 350 games held by Buddy Hield. Robinson previously set the NBA all-time records for the fewest games to 900, 800, 700, 600, 500, 400, 300 and 200. Below are the fewest games to 1,000 made threes in NBA history.

1,500: The HEAT recorded their franchise's 1,500th regular season victory on 1/31 vs. SAC, becoming the 10th-fastest team in NBA history to reach their 1,500th win, doing so in their 2,851st game. They surpassed Chicago who claimed their 1,500th victory in game 2,875. Additionally, the Seattle SuperSonics are ninth, having accomplished the feat in 2,786 games.

DISHING: The HEAT dished out 38 assists vs. SAC on 1/31, tying the third-most assists in franchise history. Miami made 42 field goals in the game, resulting in a 90.5 percent assist-to-field goals made percentage, the highest in team history. Below are the highest assist-to-field goals made percentages in HEAT history.

FRANCHISE FIRST: Bam Adebayo recorded 15 points, 15 rebounds, six assists and a career-high six blocks on 1/24 vs. MEM, becoming the first player in franchise history to reach at least each of those totals. Additionally, he also became just the fourth HEAT player with at least 15 rebounds and six blocks, joining Hassan Whiteside, Alonzo Mourning and Rony Seikaly.

ON BOTH ENDS: Jimmy Butler recorded at least one steal and connected on at least one three-point field goal in 15-straight games from 1/24 – 3/7, tying the longest streak in team history. Below are the longest streaks of at least one steal and one made three-point field goal in HEAT history.

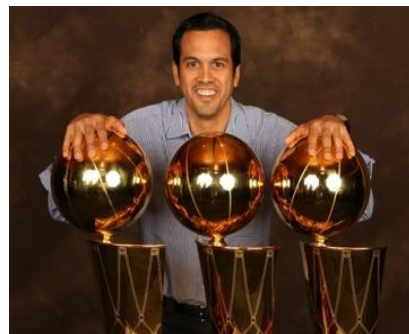

ERIK SPOELSTRA (Portland)

Regular Season Coaching Record: 747-526, currently in 16th Season

Postseason Coaching Record: 109-75, 12 postseason appearances

Erik Spoelstra is in his 16th season as head coach of the HEAT and his 29th as a member of the organization. He was elevated to his current position on April 28, 2008. Spoelstra has rewarded the faith that HEAT President Pat Riley showed in him by garnering 12 postseason appearances, nine division titles, six conference championships and guiding the franchise to back-to-back NBA titles in 2012 and 2013. Recognized as one of the game's best coaches, Spoelstra was selected as one of the NBA's 15 Greatest Coaches in NBA History and has earned Coach of the Month honors 10 times, tying the sixth-most in NBA history.



In his previous 15 seasons at the helm, Spoelstra has made his mark on the HEAT record book as the winningest coach in franchise history. Entering this season, he holds team records in wins, winning percentage and games coached. He has also been honored as the NBA's Eastern Conference Coach of the Month a franchise-record nine times. His 12 postseason appearances in his previous 15 seasons tie the second-most over that span in the NBA as Spoelstra has never missed the playoffs in consecutive seasons since becoming head coach.

When Spoelstra first took over the head coaching duties in 2008, he was given the task of improving a young team that had been ravaged by injuries the previous season and had won just 15 games. He then recorded 43 wins in his first season, the most by a first year HEAT coach in team history, while on his way to a postseason berth. Miami became just the second team in NBA history to make the playoffs after winning 15-or-fewer games the previous season. The only other team to do so was the 1968-69 San Diego Rockets, in which HEAT President Pat Riley was a member of.

From 2010-14, Spoelstra took one of the most scrutinized teams and guided them to consecutive NBA Championships, four-straight Conference Championships and four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, becoming just the third franchise in NBA history to make four consecutive NBA Finals appearances, joining the Celtics and Lakers. It also made them just one of 10 franchises in the four major North American sports leagues to make four consecutive trips to the league championship. Individually, Spoelstra became just the fourth head coach in NBA history to lead his team to four-straight Finals appearances joining Red Auerbach, K.C. Jones and Pat Riley. Spoelstra also joined a very elite fraternity when he led the HEAT to a seven-game series win over the San Antonio Spurs in the 2013 NBA Finals. Upon capturing the 2013 NBA Championship he became one of just 13 head coaches in NBA history to have won multiple championships and only the eighth to win a championship in consecutive seasons.

The 2012 championship culminated a compressed 2011-12 season in which Miami went 46-20 and captured its second consecutive Southeast Division title. The regular season was highlighted by a nine-game win streak (Feb. 10-Mar. 1) with each victory a double-digit win. During that streak the HEAT became the first team to win road games on three consecutive nights (Feb. 12-14) since December of 1979 and the first to win each of those contests by double-digits since the 1970-71 season.

Before taking over as the sixth head coach in HEAT history, Spoelstra had served Miami in a number of roles in his first 13 years. He was originally hired as video coordinator and over the years was promoted to assistant coach/video coordinator, assistant coach/advance scout and assistant coach/director of scouting, a title he held during Miami's 2006 NBA Championship, before ascending to head coach. He made a name for himself around the league with his game preparation and superb attention to detail. In his seven seasons as the HEAT's assistant coach/director of scouting, he had the primary role of developing game plans for upcoming opponents. To that end, he coordinated the video staff and advance scouts while overseeing the development of scouting reports and videos.

In 1992, he graduated from the University of Portland with a degree in communications. While attending Portland, Spoelstra was the starting point guard for four years and was named the West Coast Conference Freshman of the Year in 1989. Upon graduating he spent two years as a player/coach for Tus Herten, a team in the professional sports league of Germany.

He has returned to his native Philippines to host clinics and promote education, health and wellness to thousands of at-risk youth through grassroots programs and events. The 9-day program in Manila in the summer of 2011 was the largest NBA FIT event ever hosted in Southeast Asia under the NBA Cares umbrella. In the summer of 2012, Coach Spoelstra expanded his reach into other Southeast Asia nations by conducting coaches clinics and other FIT activities in Singapore.

Raised in Portland, OR, Spoelstra, who was inducted into the Jesuit High School Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2009, is the first Asian/Filipino-American head coach in any of the major North American sports leagues. Spoelstra is the son of Jon Spoelstra, a long-time NBA executive who has guided the Portland Trail Blazers, Denver Nuggets, Buffalo Braves and New Jersey Nets. His grandfather, Watson, was a Detroit Tigers beat writer for many years. In his free time, Spoelstra enjoys spending time with his sons Santiago and Dante and daughter, Ruby, and their dog Rosie.
