Pro Career Highlights: Spent the 2007-08 season in the NBA Developmental League with the Rio Grande Valley Vipers, averaging 7.6 points and 4.9 rebounds. Started 31 of 49 games. Scored in double figures 17 times and posted three double-doubles. Selected by the Vipers in the second round (24th pick overall) of the 2007 NBA D-League Draft.

College Highlights: Earned First Team All-Horizon League honors his junior and senior seasons. Finished collegiate career as Youngstown State's eighth all-time leading scorer with 1,707 points. Also ranks tenth all-time in rebounding (674), third in three-point field goals made (175), third in steals (137), eighth in blocked shots (46), and is the all-time leader in games played (114) and minutes played (3,689). Posted 17 career double-doubles.

Senior (2006-07): Ranked second in the Horizon League in scoring (18.8 ppg) and ranked fourth in rebounding (7.1 rpg). Also ranked seventh in the league in assists (3.0 apg), ninth in free throw percentage (.775), and sixth in steals (1.4 spg). Scored 20 or more points 14 times. Registered six double-doubles. Exploded for a career-high 37 points on 13-for-15 shooting, 8-for-9 from three-point range, and added ten rebounds and seven assists vs. Illinois-Chicago. Sank eight threes in scoring 36 points vs. Detroit. Tallied 35 points and 11 rebounds vs. Wright State. Scored 15 points at Ohio State. Posted 22 points and seven rebounds at Michigan State.

Junior (2005-06): Led the Horizon League in scoring (19.2 ppg) and rebounding (8.3 rpg), only the second player in league history to accomplish the feat. Also ranked eighth in the conference in field goal shooting (.496). Scored 20 or more points 11 times and posted ten double-doubles. Recorded season-high 33 points at Illinois-Chicago, 32 points at Loyola-Chicago, and 31 points vs. Wisconsin-Green Bay in consecutive games. Tallied 17 points and 14 rebounds vs. Butler and posted a 29-point, season-high 15-rebound double-double in the rematch. Registered 29 points and ten rebounds vs. Kent State.

Sophomore (2004-05): Averaged 14.4 points (ranked eighth in the Horizon) and 5.4 rebounds. Started all 28 games. Scored 20 or more points four times. Recorded season-high 26 points vs. Loyola-Chicago and scored 20 points in the rematch. Posted a double-double of 16 points and a season-high ten rebounds at Duquesne. Tallied 12 points, nine rebounds, and a season-high five assists at Cleveland State. Scored 22 points and grabbed six rebounds vs. Loyola-Chicago in the first round of the Horizon League Tournament.

Freshman (2003-04): Averaged 6.8 points and 2.6 rebounds in 20.3 minutes a contest. Started 17 of 27 games. Scored in double figures four times. Posted season-high 17 points at Boston University. Tallied 15 points vs. Slippery Rock. Scored ten points vs. Oakland. Grabbed a season-high seven rebounds at Bowling Green. Registered 15 points at Butler.
